4.2 Support small initiatives for Community Based Organizations & NGOs, with particular attention to women, that enable them to better use/optimize natural resources to generate economic, social and environmental benefits and in the process, enhance women's role in sustainable development. Implement the value chain socio-economic projects within municipalities in partnership with Community Based Organizations & NGOs.

Project Description: Rennovating a visitor's center (Ecotourism hub) managed by the Mumia Organization. The intervention will help build the capacity of the organization while fixing the visitor's center and adding signage to bring it to a fully operational level. Solar panels will provide power to the center while the reuse of gray will add the element of water management to fulfill the NEXUS approach. MINARET will help link organizations and products with Mumia in order for the center to provide services to tourists and sell them organic and homemade products. The center will be beneficial to the environment by managing the number of tourists and their hikes. The center will provide job opportunities to locals in Al-Karak, including women who will be responsible for sourcing the food and gift products that will be sold in the nature shop in the center, and the bedding items used in the camp.
