"MINARET Access to Finance Intervention in Municipalities"

Tuesday 28 January 2020, 10:00 - 14:00 The St. Regis Amman Hotel, Amman, Jordan

Co-organizer: United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Western Asia (ESCWA) - Beirut, Lebanon.

Background:

MINARET is expected to result in a new and transformative agenda for municipalities. The implementation of Access to Finance at municipal level will require innovative, multi-sectoral and multidimensional approaches. The project represents a roadmap for municipalities and investors explaining legal, financial, and administrative requirements for establishing public private partnerships at the regional and national level.

Underpinning the Access to Finance intervention, MINARET supports local governance at the municipal level in areas of improved service delivery, organizational management, public engagement, community cohesion, and decentralization preparation. Since municipalities face difficulties in financing capital assets and covering deficit due to high operating expenses, including salaries and wages, this prevents local governments from providing or expanding public services, pursuant to their mandate in the municipalities' law. In addition, there are issues related to limited financial resources facing these municipalities. MINARET plans to improve the business environment at the local level to attract investors and developers. This shall be accomplished by empowering municipal councils and improving local leadership, planning, and accountability to enhance governance, increase participatory planning (by putting citizens at the heart of the planning and development process), and support partnerships between the public and private sector to increase training and employment. A decentralized approach will leverage local resources and key interventions to reduce bureaucratic obstacles and increase competitiveness.

With that being said, municipalities should be equipped to properly take on new responsibilities and leading roles in implementing decentralized tasks al the local level under the local rules, regulations and constitutions. This means that the municipal administrations shall plan and manage along sectoral lines in a coordinated and integrative manner, to become able to fully maximize the synergies between water, energy, food or land and the potential co-benefits arising from integrated resource management. Consequently, the nexus approach intends to integrate planning and management processes of the key sectors of energy, water and food/land considering the resources and contributing to the long-term sustainable development of the rapidly growing municipalities in MENA regions.

Expected Outcomes:

- 1. Improve the understanding of current municipal capacities and effectiveness to deliver key services.
- 2. Provide insight on community perceptions of municipal effectiveness and responsiveness, as well as mechanisms through which municipalities communicate with investors and seek trust.
- 3. Provide a comprehensive understanding of the position of Gender Equity and Social Inclusion within the community with regards to their engagement with the municipality, barriers faced in such engagement, and their level of participation in planning and decision-making processes for municipal service delivery.
- 4. Improve regional and national coordination and service delivery.

Modality of event:

The event will be organized in the form of a theater shape consisting of high-level representatives from local municipalities (mayors), national governments, international organizations and bilateral donors, and a linear table of panelists that includes speakers specialized in the area of Access to Finance within NEXUS Approach at the municipal level. Each side will share knowledge and experience in decentralization and how such an approach can be responsive to both the SDGs and the municipalities' mandate.
